Expocobre 2023: There will be 140 technical lectures, 30 commercial talks and the fair expects to receive 10,000 visitors.

The mining event will take place from May 29 to June 1 at the Jockey Club of Peru's Exhibition Center

The organizing committee of Expocobre 2023, the event that brings together the main experts and specialists of the copper mining sector, which will be held from May 29 to June 1, 2023 in Peru, confirmed that 140 technical lectures and 30 commercial talks will be offered on specialized mining topics.

These talks will be distributed in four halls (Apurímac, Arequipa, Cusco, Junín) during the four days of the event, which is officialized by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, through Secretarial Resolution No. 0236-2023-RE.

The topics to be discussed are Automation, digital transformation, technology, innovation and research; Processing plant and metallurgy; Maintenance/projects and engineering; Environment and social responsibility; Logistics/suppliers and mining cluster; Exploration and geology; Legislation, mining economics and marketing and pricing; health, safety and human resources, Maintenance and engineering projects.

On the other hand, it was also reaffirmed that the exhibition fair will have around 100 stands from different national and foreign companies, which will showcase the latest in innovation and technology for the development of the mining industry.

Expocobre 2023 will have an exhibition area of more than 10,000 m² and expects to receive more than 10,000 visitors who will enjoy a rich program that includes 30 keynote lectures and 7 panel discussions.

The conclave is presided over by an Advisory Committee made up of Edgardo Orderique, Operations General Manager of Minera Las Bambas; Carlos Cotera, General Manager of Compañía Minera Antapaccay; Javier del Río, Senior VP South America and USA Business Units- Hudbay Minerals Inc. and Francisco Lecaros, president of Fundación Minera de Chile.
